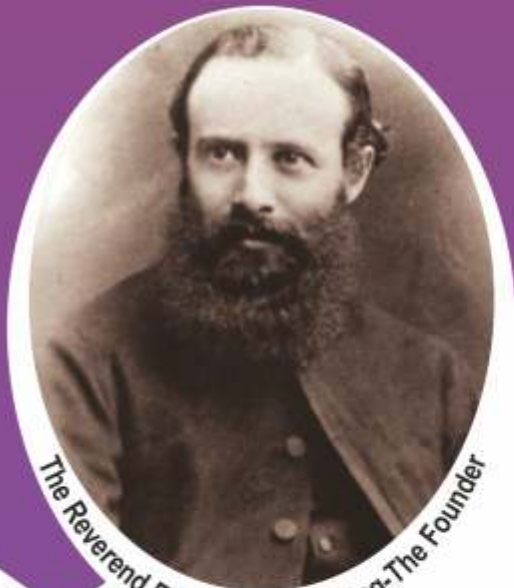

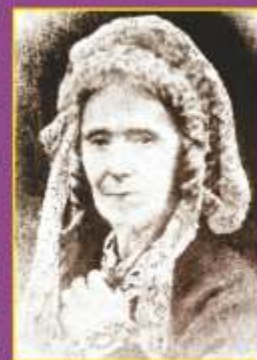

# COLLEGE PROFILE

Baring Union Christian College owes its existence to the vision and devotion shared and nurtured by Rev. Francis Henry Baring and Miss Charlotte Marie Tucker, and many other educational reformers. With mutual support Rev. Baring and Miss Tucker established Baring School in 1934.

To serve and empower the people of the region the school was upgraded to a College in 1944 upto Intermediate classes. In March 1947, despite the communal disturbances, the college started functioning again. After partition, this was the only Christian College in North-West of Delhi. A full graduate program was introduced in 1948 and Post Graduation was introduced in 1966. Baring is one of the oldest colleges in Punjab affiliated first to Punjab University, and later to Guru Nanak Dev University. Interestingly the country mansion of Maharaja Sher Singh (Son of Maharaja Ranjit Singh) was chosen as an ideal setting for learning by Rev. Baring.

Along with its three sister institutions (Christian Institute for Religious Studies, Baring Collegiate Senior Secondary School and Baring School) the college is administered by Baring Union Christian College Association (BUCCA), a registered society. Presently the office bearers of BUCCA are The Rt. Reverend Manoj Charan, (Bishop, Diocese of Amritsar), CNI (Chairman); Rev. Yunas Massey (Bishop, Diocese of Chandigarh) (Vice Chairman) & Dr. Derick Engles (Honorary Secretary).

The college is located at Batala (Punjab) on the Batala-Jalandhar road,

one and half kilometer from the local bus stand and close to the historic tomb of Shamsheer Khan. The administrative offices are located in the historic summer palace of Maharaja Sher Singh. The sylvan surroundings of the college coupled with an excellent infrastructure provide a conducive ambience for scholarly pursuits.

Getting admission in Baring is a matter of great pride as our students not only graduate with excellent academic credentials but also feel a positive transformation taking place in their personality. ## Documents Required at the Time of Admission

- Three recent coloured passport size photographs with name, class and Admission Form Number written on their back. Two photos must be pasted on Admission Form at the specified space & one photo with name, class & form no. must be attached with form.
- A Character Certificate from Head of the Institution last attended (for the students from other Educational Institutions).
- University / Board's DMC / Copy of Result of the previous examination.
- Students coming from other colleges must deposit Inter-College Migration Certificate issued by the university.
- Migration certificate, in case of students from other University/ Board.
- A certificate of proof of Caste / Class / Border Area / Sports / Defence / Terrorist Affected / Physically Handicapped from a competent authority with a proof of Annual Income, Aadhar Card, Bank Account Number, Name & Address of Bank Branch and IFSC Code (wherever applicable)
- A photocopy of Aadhar Card of the student.

## Admission Procedure, Rules & Guidelines

- Step 1 :** i) Fill the Admission form duly in your own handwriting.  
ii) Paste Two (2) Passport - Size Photographs and attach/staple other one (1) with the filled Admission form.  
iii) Enclose a photocopy of your Aadhar Card.  
iv) If you are coming from other college, then you must attach Inter-College Migration Certificate issued by the University.  
v) Get the filled Admission Form Signed / Thumb Impressed by Parents / Guardian.
- Step 2 :** Get the filled Admission Form verified from Eligibility Committee.
- Step 3 :** Get the filled Admission Form signed by Admission Committee.

- Step 4 :** Get the signature of the Principal.  
**Step 5 :** Deposit the fee in the Accounts Office.

- \* Students are advised to contact Guidance Committee for any help regarding admission.
- \* The Principal reserves the right to grant / refuse admission to any student without assigning any reason.
- \* The Fee once deposited will not be refunded.
- \* Students admitted provisionally to any semester / course will be given regular admission only after providing the relevant certificate as proof (as per the requirements of GNDU / Punjab Government).

## Attendance Requirement For University Examination

A student must attend at least 75% of the full course of lectures delivered to the theory classes in each subject and 75% of the periods assigned to practical work in the concerned subject. In a special case, the Principal shall have the authority to condone the shortage as per chapter 15 (II) 1.1 of GNDU Calendar / 2008, volume-II.

## Discipline Matters

- Each student is issued an **Identity Card** which he / she must always carry and shall produce whenever asked by the college authorities. No student will be allowed to enter the college premises without the Identity Card. A student must write his/her time table on I Card.
- The names of the students remaining **absent consecutively for six lectures or twelve days in a month will be struck off** from the college rolls. They can be re-admitted as per the college rules.
- **Use of Mobile Phones is strictly prohibited for students in**

**the classrooms, labs, library, corridors of Academic blocks.** The defaulter will be **fined Rs.1500/-** and the **mobile phone will be confiscated.**

- **Smoking and drinking is strictly prohibited** at College Campus, Hostel, Canteen etc. Any student **caught violating rules will be severely penalized & punished.**
- Students are not to invite / bring non-scholars to the college. Any student found guilty will face strict disciplinary action.
- Students are expected to focus more on academic and co-academic activities.





# UNIVERSITY RULES FOR PROMOTION OF STUDENTS UNDER SEMESTER SYSTEM\*



## FOR SIX - SEMESTER COURSES

B A, B Com (Regular), B Sc ( Medical / Non-Medical / Computer Science / IT / Economics), BCA

- There shall be no condition for promoting a student from 1st Semester to 2nd Semester.
- A student shall be promoted to the 3rd Semester only if he / she has passed at least 50% courses / papers of the first two semesters.
- There shall be no condition for promoting a student from 3rd Semester to 4th Semester.
- A student shall be promoted to 5th Semester only if he / she has passed at least 50% courses / papers of the first four semesters.
- A student shall be promoted to 6th Semester only if he / she has passed all the papers of the first semester. After the period of six semesters, the student shall be given a period of two consecutive years to pass.

## FOR FOUR - SEMESTER COURSES

M Sc (Information Technology), M Sc (Computer Science), M Com, M A (English), M A (Hindi), M A (Punjabi)

- There shall be no condition for promoting a student from 1st Semester to 2nd Semester.
- A student shall be promoted to the 3rd Semester only if he / she has passed at least 50% courses / papers of the first two semesters.
- There shall be no condition for promoting a student from 3rd Semester to 4th Semester.
- In case a student fails to pass all the courses / papers within a period of four semesters (two years), he / she shall be given four consecutive semesters (two years) more to pass.

## FOR TWO - SEMESTER COURSES

PGDCA (Post Graduate Diploma in Computer Applications), DCA (Diploma in Computer Applications), DWD (Diploma in Web Designing)

- There shall be no condition for promoting a student from 1st semester to 2nd semester.
- In case a student fails to pass all the courses / papers within period of two semesters (one year), he / she will be given two consecutive semesters (one year) more to pass.

## Ragging - free Campus **Ragging is a Crime**

**ANTI RAGGING UNDERTAKING :** As per the directions of Hon. Supreme court & UGC/MHRD regulations, it is mandatory for every student to fill an online form of "Anti Ragging Undertaking" which is available at [www.amanmovement.org](http://www.amanmovement.org) (OR) [www.antiragging.in](http://www.antiragging.in) Further, you are instructed to deposit the printout after filling up the online undertaking form to the College Library to get your identity card, within 3 to 5 days after your admission.



UGC vide letter no. F-1-15 / 2009 / (ACR) dated 25.02.2016 has reinforced / recognized a system of prohibition, prevention and punishment to put an END TO MENACE OF RAGGING.

**WHAT IS RAGGING ?** According to the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India, ragging includes "disorderly behavior or treatment with fellow student whether by words, spoken or written or by an act which has effect of teasing, treating and handling with rudeness with any other student, indulging in rowdy or indecent activities, which may cause or is likely to cause physical or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in a fresher or a junior student."

Some of the **PUNISHMENTS** for students involved directly or indirectly in Ragging and its abetment are as follows :

- Cancellation of Admission
- Suspension from classes
- Expulsion from the college
- Fine upto Rs. 25000/-
- Lodging of FIR/ Police action against on offender
- Rigorous imprisonment upto 3 years (under the Court of Law)

## FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

One of the aims of the college is to provide education to the underprivileged and deserving students from nearby villages and from economically weaker sections. Brilliant and deserving students may be given full tuition fee concession. Students may receive relevant financial assistance from Punjab Government as per rules.

In the midst of our modern buildings, the college chapel, built in 1897, still remains the most beautiful structure. There is abundance of artistic details throughout its structure. Most part of its design is of Rev. Henry Baring and it offers a striking blend of Sikh, Muslim and European architecture. The items of particular interest are the stained glass windows, the wood carving and the mosaic floor in the chapel. The large double door at the entrance is beautifully carved with Biblical symbols, parables and verses. The college begins its day's work with worship in the chapel. Both the staff and the students lead the service voluntarily. Chapel Prayer Hall remains open during college hours. Students & staff of all faiths are welcome to offer their prayers.

Along with providing guidance to their intellect, Baring college has always sought to nurture the spiritual faculties of students, the Counseling Centre on the college premises fulfills the psycho-spiritual needs of students. The Rev. Pawan Paul has been actively engaged in organizing various activities like seminars, meetings and counseling sessions etc. with students to provide a value orientation to their lives.



## Supportive Services & Spaces

### LIBRARY

The computerised Wi-Fi college library has earned a reputation for its vast collection of books. The three-storey library building has a seating capacity for 400 students at a time and it can stock more than one lakh books. The building provides all amenities for serious reading including fully air-conditioned library hall. At present, the library has more than 82,000 books on various branches of knowledge; it receives more than 80 journals / magazines /periodicals and daily newspapers. Besides this it has a good collection of maps and other non-book reading material. The library collection is well classified, catalogued and kept on OPEN SHELVES in a systematic way. The students have full freedom to take any book of their choice from the shelves, read and get it issued for home use. The library has General Reading Hall. News paper and Magazine Section Reference Section Reading Room for Teachers. Science and Commerce Section MA English Reading Hall MA Punjabi Section MA Hindi Section MSc IT & Computer Science section.



MA English Reading Hall has about 10,500 books on literature & criticism. The library is spacious and well furnished with individual carrels for serious study. MA Punjabi section has more than 7000 books on criticism with good number of journals on language and literature. All the post graduate students are required to study for two hours daily in the library and it is part of their attendance. Library collection is updated every year.

### BOOK BANK



To assist the disadvantaged and deserving students the college provides Book Bank facility. This section has more than 18,000 books. Through this scheme text books are issued to the needy & meritorious students for full academic session.



## RESEARCH CENTRE



A special computer lab having 10 computers with internet facility has been setup in the Dr. Ram Singh Library of the college for students and academic research scholars.

The college is proud to have one of the oldest, well maintained Botanical Garden in the entire region. Apart from providing a green feast to the beholders, it is utilized by the students of Botany department for practical research projects and assignments mentioned in syllabus.

## COLLEGE PUBLICATIONS

The college magazine *Deepshikha* is published once in a year. It is a periodical of students and staff which contains



articles, poems and stories of general interest besides the college news. It offers a chance to the students to manifest their creative and critical potential. This field study helps students in taking up different projects at PG level and higher studies. 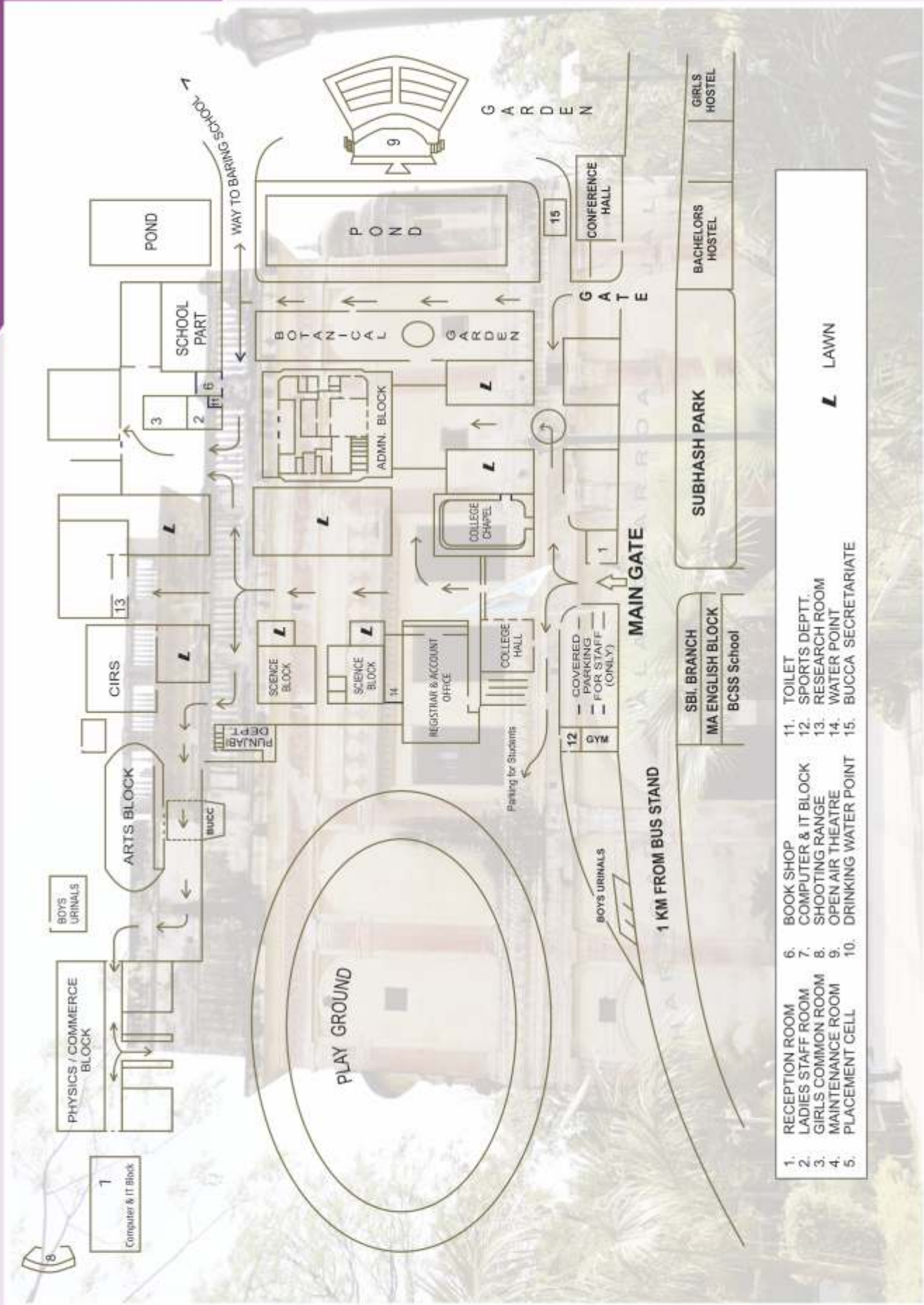
